#### EDWIN JOHN PRATT

My Lord Chief Justice, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen:

As a university with a proud literary tradition, it is fitting that the University of New Brunswick should pay its tribute to Edwin John Pratt, the greatest living Canadian poet. By his vigorous narratives, his subtle lyrics, and the deeply humane vision which pervades all his work, Dr. Pratt has won the admiration of all lovers of poetry.

Born in Newfoundland, Dr. Pratt moved to Toronto as a young man to complete his education at the University of Toronto. After toying for a year or two with the unpoetic discipline of psychology, he became a member of the Department of English at Victoria College and was a much-loved professor there until his recent retirement.

His first book of verse, *Newfoundland Verse*, appeared in 1923, and was followed by such outstanding volumes as *Titans*, *The Witches' Brew*, *The Iron Door*, *The Roosevelt and the Antioe*, *The Titanic*, *The Fable of the Goats*, *Brébeuf and His Brethren*, and *Towards the Last Spike*. As student, professor, and poet he has always exhibited qualities of energy, courage, optimism, and compassion which have endeared him to all who have known him.

The alma mater of Roberts, Carman and Sherman is proud to welcome Edwin John Pratt, great man and great poet.

#### ARTHUR DEINSTADT GANONG

My Lord Chief Justice, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen:

The University of New Brunswick today honours one of its most distinguished alumni and one of the finest athletes ever to wear the Red and Black colours. The late Chancellor C. C. Jones, a great connoisseur of football players, once described him as the greatest halfback ever to wear a U.N.B. uniform.

From this university, Arthur Ganong entered the family business which had been established in 1872 by his uncle James H. Ganong. The drive and initiative which had served him so well on the athletic field were now transmitted to the world of business. In a short space of time, he became manager and ultimately president of his firm, a post which he held until a few weeks ago when, after sixty years of service, he became chairman of the board. In addition to his activities in the world of business, Arthur Ganong has played an important part in promoting the welfare of his native Charlotte County and the Province of New Brunswick. As a Member of Parliament, a member of four New Brunswick Royal Commissions, and as a member of the Senate of this university, he has devoted a large part of his life to public affairs.

In Arthur Deinstadt Ganong, the University of New Brunswick honours a distinguished son whose life illustrates the fact that it is possible to build and maintain a large and successful business, manufacturing in New Brunswick but selling throughout the length and breadth of the Canadian nation.

## HUGH MASON WADE

My Lord Chief Justice, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen:

In Mason Wade, Director of Canadian Studies at the University of Rochester, we honour a man who is the foremost authority upon what makes Canada unique among nations, its bilingual character and culture.

As a young man, he became acutely aware of the interesting experiment in nation-building on the northern borders of his state of Vermont. He read the works of Francis Parkman, dealing with the conflicts between English and French during the 18th century, and ever since he has followed in the path of his master. He wrote a biography of Parkman, a scholarly edition of Parkman's journals, and many articles in periodical publications, endeavouring to understand and explain the complexities of Anglo-French relations in Canada.

In 1955, in consummation of years of devoted labour, there came a monumental work that has become essential to students of Canadian history. *The French Canadians* is the most complete and scholarly study written in English upon the establishment and expansion of the French race in North America. The trail blazed by Parkman has been widened and carried as far as the mid-twentieth century. The young man from Vermont, whose antecedents are Yankee, has made a great contribution not only to scholarship but to the mutual understanding of French and English Canadians.

The province of New Brunswick is an area in which French and English-speaking people meet, work, and live together. Here the significance of Mr. Wade's work is highly appreciated. In recognition of this the University is proud to confer upon him the degree of Doctor of Laws.

## SIDNEY EARLE SMITH

My Lord Chief Justice, Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen:

In honouring Sidney Earle Smith, we honour the great president of a great Canadian University, the University of Toronto. As teacher, scholar, and administrator Sidney Smith has made a distinguished contribution to university education in Canada, and by his ready wit, his unflinching courage, and his broad human sympathy he has won a multitude of friends.

A native of our sister province of Nova Scotia and a graduate of King's College, Dalhousie and Harvard Universities, Dr. Smith was successively lecturer, assistant professor, and dean of the Dalhousie Law School, president for ten years of the University of Manitoba, and principal of University College, Toronto. Since 1945 he has been president of the University of Toronto. He is the author of several scholarly books and of many articles, and has served as chairman of various Canadian societies, including the National Conference of Canadian Universities, the United Nations Association of Canada, and the Association of Canadian Clubs. In short, no Canadian of his generation has enjoyed more universal respect.

The contribution of Dr. Smith has been formally recognized by a host of universities in Canada, Great Britain, and the United States, and it is with pride that we of the University of New Brunswick add his name to the roll of our alumni.

## ACADEMIC DRESS

### GOWNS

- Undergraduates — Plain black stuff material, sleeveless.
- Bachelors — Black stuff gown falling below knee, with full sleeve reaching to the wrist and terminating in a point.
- Masters — Black silk or stuff gown, falling below knee, with long sleeves with semi-circular cut bottom.
- Doctors — A scarlet cloth robe, faced with silk of the same colour as the lining of the hood worn.

### HOODS

Each degree has its distinctive hood as follows:

- B.A. — Black stuff bordered with white fur.
- B.Sc. — (Arts) black stuff lined with scarlet silk bordered with white fur
- B.Sc. — (Applied) black stuff lined with green silk bordered with white fur.
- B.C.L. — Pale blue silk bordered with white fur.
- B.B.A. — Black stuff lined with light brown silk bordered with white fur.
- B.Ed. — Black stuff lined with blue grey silk bordered with white fur.
- M.A. — Black silk lined with crimson silk.
- M.Sc. — (Arts) black silk lined with white silk bordered with scarlet.
