ACADEMIC DRESS

Bachelors — Black stuff falling below knee, with full sleeve reaching to the wrist and terminating at a point.

HOODS

B.A.	— Black stuff bordered with white fur
B.B.A.	— Black stuff lined with light brown silk bordered with white fur
B.T.	— Black stuff lined with royal blue silk bordered with white fur
B.Ed.	— Black stuff lined with grey silk bordered with white fur
M.Sc.	— Black silk lined with white silk bordered with scarlet

Although Latin has long ceased to be the language of instruction for all university courses, as it once was at Oxford and Cambridge, at Paris and Bologna, it is traditional to retain it for limited use on occasions of great academic solemnity, such as university convocations. The Use of Latin today is a symbol of our academic descent from these earliest universities of mediaeval Europe and a humble reminder that the search for truth is both new and ancient.

MASTERS' AND BACHELORS' DEGREES

Orator: *Insignissime Praeses, supplicanti Collegio Gubernatorum et huic venerabili domo Convocationis . . . , in Facultate Artium . . . , in Facultate Scientiae . . . , quorum nomina ac studia iam rite cognita sunt et promulgata, ut admittantur ad proprium Magistri (Baccalaurei), gradum in sua quisque Facultate.*

Praeses: *Placetne vobis, Doctores, placetne, Magistri, ut hi supplicatores admittantur?*

Gubernatores: *Placet.*

Orator: *Insignissime Praeses, amplissime Cancellari, tota Universitas, praesento vobis hosce Supplicatores in supra dictis Facultatibus, ad admittantur ad proprium Magistri (Baccalaurei) gradum in sua quisque Facultate; testorque illos quoad omnia quae statuta nostra requirant aptos et idoneos esse.*

Praeses: *Ego admitto vos ad gradum Magistri (Baccalaurei) in Universitate Novi Brunsvici.*

Orator: Most distinguished President, there supplicate the Board of Governors and this venerable house of Convocation, in the Faculty of Arts . . . , in the Faculty of Science . . . , whose names and studies are now formally made known and proclaimed, that they may be admitted to their proper degree of Master (Bachelor), each in his (her) own Faculty.

President: Is it your pleasure, Doctors, is it your pleasure, Masters, that these supplicants be admitted?

Governors: It is our pleasure.

Orator: Most distinguished President, most noble Chancellor, all the University, I present to you these supplicants in the above mentioned Faculties that they may be admitted to their proper degree of Master (Bachelor), each in his (her) own Faculty; and I testify that they, so far as all our statutes require, are fit and suitable.

President: I admit you to the degree of Master (Bachelor) in the University Of New Brunswick.
