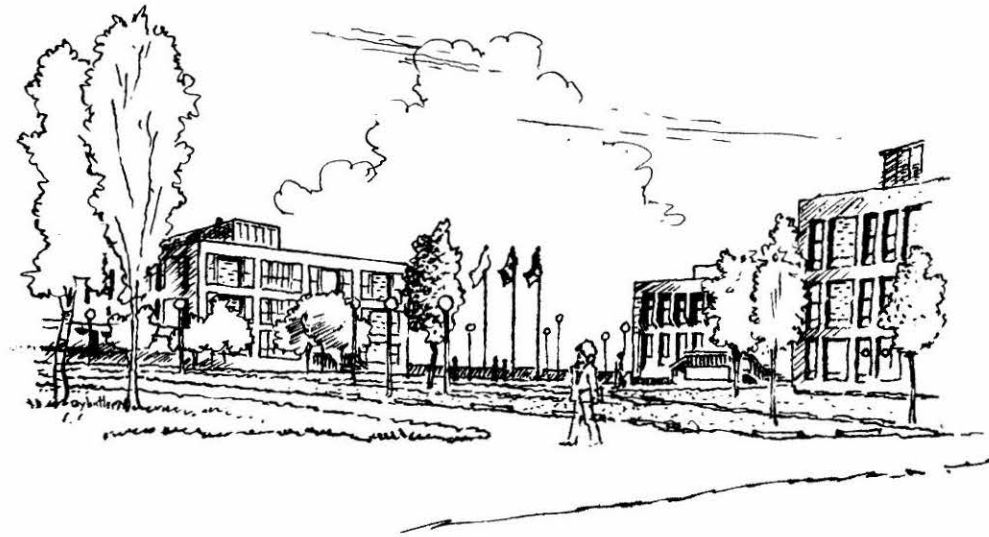

Orator: Insignissime Praeses, supplicanti Senatui et huic venerabili Collegio Gubernatorum quorum nomina ac studia iam rite cognita sunt et promulgata, ut admittantur ad proprium Magistri (Baccalaurei) gradum, in sua quisque Facultate.

Praeses: Placetne vobis, Senatores, placetne Gubernatores, ut hi Supplicatores admittantur?

Orator: Insignissime Praeses, amplissima Cancellaria, tota Universitas, praesento vobis hosce Supplicatores in supra dictis Facultatibus, ut admittantur ad proprium Magistri (Baccalaurei) gradum, in sua quisque Facultate; testorque illos quoad omnia quae statuta nostra requirant aptos et idoneos esse.

Praeses: Ego admitto vos ad gradum Magistri (Baccalaurei) in Universitate Novi Brunsvici.



Orator: Most distinguished President, there supplicate the Senate and this venerable Board of Governors whose names and studies are now formally made known and proclaimed, that they may be admitted to their proper degree of Master (Bachelor), each in his (her) own Faculty.

President: Is it your pleasure, Senators, is it your pleasure, Governors, that these supplicants be admitted?

*Governors
& Senators:* It is our pleasure.

Orator: Most distinguished President, most noble Chancellor, all the University, I present to you these supplicants in the above mentioned Faculties that they may be admitted to their proper degree of Master (Bachelor), each in his (her) own Faculty; and I testify that they, so far as all our statutes require, are fit and suitable.

President: I admit you to the degree of Master (Bachelor) in the University of New Brunswick.

GOWNS

Bachelors	—Black stuff falling below knee, with full sleeves reaching to the wrist and terminating in a point
Masters	—Black silk or stuff falling below knee, with long sleeves with semi-circular cut bottom
Doctors	—A scarlet cloth robe, faced with silk of the same colour as the lining of the hood worn

HOODS

B.A.	—Black stuff bordered with white fur
B.Sc.	—Black stuff lined with scarlet silk bordered with white fur
B.Sc. (Applied)	—Black stuff lined with green silk bordered with white fur
B.B.A.	—Black stuff lined with light brown silk bordered with white fur
B.Ed.	—Black stuff lined with blue grey silk bordered with white fur
M.Sc.	—Black silk lined with white silk bordered with scarlet
M.Ed.	—Black silk lined with blue grey silk bordered with crimson
Ph.D.	—Scarlet cloth with dark blue silk lining
LL.D.	—Scarlet cloth with pale pink silk lining
D.Sc.	—Scarlet cloth with white corded silk lining
D.C.L.	—Scarlet cloth with pale blue silk lining
D.Litt.	—Scarlet cloth with grey silk lining
