HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT

Mr. Patrick Darrah *Doctor of Science*

Patrick Darrah has held the position of Executive Director of the Saint John Construction Association since 1969 and has made numerous contributions to his community and his industry during that time.

Mr. Darrah has played an outstanding role for more than three decades in the construction industry in the city of Saint John and the province of New Brunswick. He has fostered good labour relations in a difficult industry and has been an extraordinary negotiator who seems always to reach an agreement. As a leader in pioneering workplace health and safety matters, and in representing the industry in national and international settings, Pat Darrah has been a major force in the development of the construction industry.

Mr. Darrah has played a significant role in virtually every major development in Saint John over the past 30 years, including the development of Market Square, the 1985 Jeux Canada Games, civic and provincial bicentennial celebrations, the Imperial Theatre, Harbour Station, the Aquatic Centre, the Canada Games Foundation and Port Development. He has also been a member of numerous city and regional development commissions. His wide ranging experience has been applied to numerous committees and volunteer activities throughout the course of his career.

Mr. Darrah has been recognized for his achievements with a Canada Medal in 1987, the Saint John Board of Trade's President's Award in 1997, the UNB Saint John Business Award in 1998, the United Way of Saint John's Thomas J. Higgins Award in 1999, the Queen's Jubilee Medal in March 2003, the Canadian Society of Association Executives Pinnacle Award in 2003, and the YM-YWCA Red Triangle Award in 2004.

PROFESSOR EMERITUS

Mr. Wayne Jollineau

Professor Wayne Jollineau has had a long and distinguished career at UNB and UNB Saint John and is widely credited for major developments in UNB Saint John's Faculty of Business.

Professor Jollineau was appointed an Assistant Professor at UNB in 1970 and served UNB in Fredericton and Saint John faithfully and diligently until his retirement in 1995. Over the years Professor Jollineau guided the establishment of UNB Saint John's four-year business program, ensured participation in the MBA program and developed a co-op program as well as a joint hospitality and tourism program with NBCC Saint Andrews. Professor Jollineau's commitment to the education of his students is evidenced by his reception of the excellence in teaching award.

Professor Jollineau has distinguished himself, and the University, in his various roles with the Society of Management Accountants of Canada. There he served on the National Board of Directors, the National Educational Services Committee, and the National Planning and Development Committee. He has also played several major roles within the New Brunswick organization of the Society of Management Accountants. Professor Jollineau has contributed to the University with distinction, in both teaching and service.

ABOUT THE CONVOCATION CEREMONY

The Convocation Procession

The word "convocation" means "calling together," and UNB's convocation is truly a gathering of all individuals who are part of the University – students, professors, administrators, staff, alumni, families, and friends. The ceremony starts with the procession of students, special guests, faculty, members of the Senate and of the Board of Governors, the honorary degree recipient(s), the President and Vice-Chancellor, the Chancellor and the Lieutenant-Governor of New Brunswick.

The Stage

All of the formalities around convocation take place on the stage. The stage is occupied by representatives of the Federal, Provincial and Municipal governments, the University's Chancellor, the President and Vice-Chancellor, members of the University's Board of Governors, University officials such as Vice-Presidents, Deans and Directors, University alumni, those holding emeritus status and the honorary degree recipient(s). The flags on display in the room represent the countries that are home to the international students currently studying at UNB Saint John. The banners displayed on the stage represent the various faculties in which students may study at UNB Saint John.

Academic Dress

It is part of the ceremony to wear the academic dress of the institution. It is for this reason that all of the students wear the gown, hood and cap, as do most of the University's faculty and officials. At UNB Saint John, the University's alumni are also invited to wear their academic attire and join the procession.

Latin in the Ceremony

"Although Latin has long ceased to be the language of instruction for all university courses, it is traditional to retain it for limited use on occasions of great academic solemnity, such as university convocations. The use of Latin today is a symbol of our academic descent from these earliest universities of mediaeval Europe and a humble reminder that the search for truth is both new and ancient." (TJC)

The Ceremonial Mace

The mace symbolizes the authority of the University to award degrees. Introduced in 1996, UNB's ceremonial mace features an antique silver cup atop a wooden shaft. The George II two-handed cup was given to the University in 1995 by S.A.H. Bridge, the great-great-grandson of Sir Howard Douglas, Bart. Sir Howard, Lieutenant-Governor of New Brunswick from 1823 to 1831, was instrumental in gaining the University's Royal charter.

The shaft was created by New Brunswick artisan Michiel Oudemans. Crafted from butternut, a wood indigenous to the province, it features elements of the UNB coat of arms and symbols of New Brunswick: the University motto, *Sapere aude* (Dare to know); a book of learning; beavers (in honour of Lord Beaverbrook, the University's first modern-day Chancellor); a galley; fiddleheads; and Atlantic salmon. The mace is carried in the procession by the University Secretary.

ACADEMIC DRESS

All graduates and members of the academic procession are attired in the basic elements of academic dress – the academic robe, the hood and the mortar board or Tudor hat. The dress worn by each participant depends upon the academic level attained, with special attire for Bachelors, Masters and Doctors. While tradition has indicated the style or cut of the academic attire, each university amends certain details to suit its particular tastes and traditions. Following is a guide to UNB's ceremonial attire:

GOWNS

Undergraduates	Plain black stuff, sleeveless
Bachelors	Black stuff falling below knee, with full sleeves reaching to the wrist and terminating in a point
Masters	Black silk or stuff falling below knee, with long sleeves with semi-circular cut bottom
Doctors	Scarlet cloth, faced with silk of the same colour as the lining of the hood worn

B.A.	Black stuff bordered with white fur
B.A.Sc.	Black stuff bordered with white fur and scarlet band
B.Sc.	Black stuff lined with scarlet silk bordered with white fur
B.Sc.	(Applied) Black stuff lined with green silk bordered with white fur
B.B.A.	Black stuff lined with light brown silk bordered with white fur
B.N.S.	Black stuff lined with salmon pink silk bordered with white fur
B.Ed.	Black stuff lined with blue grey silk bordered with white fur
B.H.S.	Black stuff lined with teal silk bordered with white fur
B.A.M.	Black stuff lined with bright gold silk bordered with white fur
M.A.	Black silk lined with crimson silk
M.Sc., M.C.S.	Black silk lined with white bordered with scarlet
M.Sc.E.	Black silk lined with white silk bordered with green
M.Ed.	Black silk lined with blue grey silk bordered with crimson
M.N.	Black silk lined with white silk bordered with peach
M.B.A.	Black silk lined with white silk bordered with light brown
Ph.D.	Scarlet cloth with dark blue silk lining
L.L.D.	Scarlet cloth with pale pink silk lining
D.Sc.	Scarlet cloth with white corded silk lining
D.C.L.	Scarlet cloth with pale blue silk lining
