HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT

Arthur L. Irving, *Doctor of Letters*

Arthur Irving grew up in Saint John, New Brunswick and attended Acadia University before joining Irving Oil in 1953. Since becoming President of the company in 1972, Arthur Irving has developed Irving Oil into markets in New England and Eastern Quebec and into the number one market share leader throughout the North East.

Irving Oil's refinery in Saint John is Canada's largest and has earned the reputation as a pacesetter. The refinery has carried out upgrades to increase production flexibility; shift production from heavier to lighter, more environmentally-friendly transportation fuels; and to further enhance industry-leading environmental performance. The refinery produces fuels that are years ahead of environmental regulations.

Arthur Irving's commitment to the environment extends outside his corporate interests and initiatives. An avid sportsman and outdoor enthusiast, his accomplishments include canoeing many rivers of the high Arctic, and more than 30 years of service on the Board of Directors of Ducks Unlimited, two of those as President. Under his Presidency, many milestones were reached including the 1986 signing of the North American Waterfowl Management Plan.

In 1996 Arthur Irving became Chancellor of Acadia University in Wolfville, Nova Scotia. His innovation and dedication to education extend beyond his leadership role as Chancellor. In the fall of 2002, the K.C. Irving Environmental Science Centre and the Harriet Irving Botanical Gardens were officially dedicated and turned over to Acadia University. A centre of excellence for the study of the natural environment, this gift from the Irving family fulfills Arthur Irving's vision of creating a place for students, faculty, staff and the community to meet and work in a natural setting. It is a research and teaching centre of the highest standards concentrating its studies on the ecology and native flora and fauna of the Northeast.

Arthur Irving continues as Chairman of Irving Oil, balancing a strong passion for customer service and sales, and the development of new markets with a continuing commitment to his family, community, education and the environment.

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT

Sandra L. Irving, *Doctor of Letters*

Sandra Irving received a Bachelor of Arts Degree with Distinction from the University of New Brunswick and a Master of Arts in Political Science from the University of Toronto. Her research focus is educational policy and the politics of identity.

Sandra Irving serves as Chair of the President's Advisory Council for RSC: The Academies of Arts, Humanities and Sciences of Canada and is also Co-Chair of the RSC Extending Excellence Fund Raising Campaign. In 2004 she was appointed to serve as a Canadian member of the Roosevelt Campobello International Park Commission. As well, she is a member of the University of Toronto President's International Alumni Council and the President's Leadership Council at Dartmouth College, Hanover, N.H.

A strong proponent of creating opportunities for University of New Brunswick students, she established the Sandra Irving Scholarship in 1995, a \$5,000 scholarship for University of New Brunswick Saint John Political Science students and the Primrose Scholarship, a \$5,000 entrance scholarship. At Dartmouth College where their daughter is a Senior, Sandra and her husband recently established the Sandra and Arthur Irving Family Scholarship Fund for Canadian Students and the Fund for Dartmouth Undergraduate Business Initiative in the Tuck School of Business. Sandra also created the Acadia University and Victoria College at the University of Toronto Student Exchange Program.

Together with her husband Arthur, Sandra was actively involved in the planning and development of the K.C. Irving Environmental Science Centre and the Harriett Irving Botanical Gardens for Acadia University in Wolfville, Nova Scotia, a gift from the Irving family.

Over the years Sandra has supported many non-profit, public service organizations. She served as Chairperson of the New Brunswick Junior Achiever's Business Hall of Fame in 2001 and 2002 and continues to serve as a board member. In the recent past she was a member of the Board of the New Brunswick Region 2 Health Authority, serving as Vice Chair, University of New Brunswick, the McGill Institute for Canadian Studies, the Theatre New Brunswick Foundation Inc., D.A.R.E. (Drug Awareness Resistance Education), Dialogue New Brunswick and the Boys & Girls Club of Saint John. In 2009 Sandra was Honorary Chair of the 11th Annual Rocmaura Nursing Home Foundation Gala. She previously served as Chair for the Mother-Daughter Walk for Heart & Stroke.

In January 2003 Sandra was presented with the Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal in recognition of her many volunteer and public service activities.

ABOUT THE CONVOCATION CEREMONY

The Convocation Procession

The word “convocation” means “calling together,” and UNB’s convocation is truly a gathering of all individuals who are part of the University – students, professors, administrators, staff, alumni, families, and friends. The ceremony starts with the procession of students, special guests, faculty, members of the Senate and of the Board of Governors, the honorary degree recipient(s), Chancellor, the President and the Lieutenant-Governor of New Brunswick.

The Stage

All of the formalities around convocation take place on the stage. Typically, the stage is occupied by the Lieutenant-Governor, representatives of the Federal, Provincial and Municipal governments, the University’s Chancellor, the President and Vice-Chancellor, members of the University’s Board of Governors, University officials such as Vice-Presidents, Deans and Directors, University alumni, those holding emeritus status and the honorary degree recipients. The flags at the back of the stage represent the countries that are home to the international students currently studying at UNB Saint John. The banners hanging above the stage represent the various faculties and/or schools in which students may study at UNB Saint John.

Academic Dress

It is part of the ceremony to wear the academic dress of the institution. It is for this reason that all of the students wear the gown, hood and cap, as do most of the University’s faculty and officials. At UNB Saint John, the University’s alumni are also invited to wear their academic attire and join the procession.

The Ceremonial Mace

The mace symbolizes the authority of the University to award degrees. Introduced in 1996, UNB’s ceremonial mace features an antique silver cup atop a wooden shaft. The George II two-handled cup was given to the University in 1995 by S.A.H. Bridge, the great-great-grandson of Sir Howard Douglas, Bart. Sir Howard, Lieutenant-Governor of New Brunswick from 1823 to 1831, was instrumental in gaining the University’s Royal charter.

The shaft was created by New Brunswick artisan Michiel Oudemans. Crafted from butternut, a wood indigenous to the province, it features elements of the UNB coat of arms and symbols of New Brunswick: the University motto, Sapere aude (Dare to know); a book of learning; beavers (in honour of Lord Beaverbrook, the University’s first modern-day Chancellor); a galley; fiddleheads; and Atlantic salmon.

The mace is carried in the procession by the University Secretary.

President: Is it your pleasure, Senators, is it your pleasure, Governors, that these supplicants be admitted?

Governors

& Senators: It is our pleasure.

Orator: Most distinguished President, all the University, I present to you these supplicants in the above mentioned faculties that they may be admitted to their proper degree of Master (Bachelor), each in his (her) own Faculty; and I testify that they, so far as all our statutes require, are fit and suitable.

President: I admit you to the degree of Master (Bachelor) in the University of New Brunswick.

ACADEMIC DRESS

All graduates and members of the academic procession are attired in the basic elements of academic dress – the academic robe, the hood, and the mortar board of Tudor hat. The dress worn by each participant depends upon the academic level attained, with special attire for Bachelors, Masters, and Doctors. While tradition has indicated the style or cut of the academic attire, each university amends certain details to suit its particular tastes and traditions.

Following is a guide to UNB's ceremonial dress:

GOWNS

Undergraduates	Plain black stuff, sleeveless
Bachelors	Black stuff falling below knee, with full sleeves reaching to the wrist and terminating in a point
Masters	Black silk or stuff falling below knee, with long sleeves with semi-circular cut bottom
Doctors	Scarlet cloth, faced with silk of the same colour as the lining of the hood worn

B.Sc.	Black stuff lined with scarlet silk bordered with white fur
B.Sc. (Applied)	Black silk lined with green silk bordered with white fur
B.B.A.	Black stuff lined with light brown silk bordered with white fur
B.N.	Black stuff lined with salmon pink silk bordered with white fur
B.Ed.	Black stuff lined with blue grey silk bordered with white fur
B.H.S.	Black stuff lined with teal silk bordered with white fur
B.A.M.	Black stuff lined with bright gold silk bordered with white fur
M.A.	Black silk lined with crimson silk
M.Sc., M.C.S.	Black silk lined with white bordered with scarlet
M.Ed.	Black silk lined with blue grey silk bordered with crimson
M.N.	Black silk lined with white silk bordered with peach
M.B.A.	Black silk lined with white silk bordered with light brown
Ph.D.	Scarlet cloth with dark blue silk lining
LL.D.	Scarlet cloth with pale pink silk lining
D.Sc.	Scarlet cloth with white corded silk lining
D.C.L.	Scarlet cloth with pale blue silk lining
D.Litt.	Scarlet cloth with grey silk lining
