At the beginning of Convocation the audience is requested to stand when the Academic Procession arrives and to remain standing until the close of the Petition by the President. At the close of the Convocation ceremony, following the singing of *O Canada*, the audience should remain standing until the Academic Procession has left the stage.

Graduates are asked to remain in their seats until the Convocation ceremony is completed as a sign of respect and consideration for their classmates.

Although Latin has long ceased to be the language of instruction for all university courses, as it once was at Oxford and Cambridge, at Paris and Bologna, we have retained it at UNB for limited use on occasions of great academic solemnity, such as university convocations. The use of Latin today is a symbol of our academic descent from those earliest universities of medieval Europe and a humble reminder that the search for truth is both ancient and new.

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT**Jane Bertrand, Doctor of Letters**

Jane Bertrand received an Early Childhood Education Diploma from St. Lawrence College (1975), a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from Queen's University (1976) and a Master of Education in Applied Psychology from the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education at the University of Toronto (1986).

Jane Bertrand has been a leader in Canada on the importance of early human development on the life course of individuals in respect to health, learning and behaviour. This knowledge has had profound implications for post-secondary programs in universities and colleges.

Ms. Bertrand has worked tirelessly, and effectively, to change the Early Child Development (ECD) landscape in this country. Her research is internationally acclaimed, and she has provided exemplary leadership to early childhood educators, researchers and policy thinkers to ensure that early childhood practice is grounded in evidence that helps to inform progressive child- and family-centred policy.

Ms. Bertrand has worked with governments across Canada in developing policy around ECD, most recently with the past two governments in New Brunswick. In addition, she acted as a consultant and speaker for the Obama administration and for several state governments in Australia.

Currently, Ms. Bertrand is the Program Director at the Margaret & Wallace McCain Family Foundation. The Foundation's focus is on the early years agenda in Canada, and it published *Early Years Study 3* (McCain, Mustard & McCuaig) in 2011. She has worked in close collaboration with Dr. Fraser Mustard and the Honourable Margaret Norrie McCain over the past 15 years in promoting the early years agenda in Canada and internationally.

Ms. Bertrand was a professor at the School of Early Childhood at George Brown College in Toronto, where she initiated a Bachelor of Early Childhood Leadership degree. She worked closely with the Ontario Early Learning Advisor to the Premier of Ontario and contributed to *Our Best Future in Mind* (Pascal, 2009) and the accompanying literature review and curriculum report.

A member of the Directing Committee of the Centre for Excellence for Early Child Development, she was also a member of the Toronto First Duty Research and Development team from the Atkinson Centre at Ontario Institute for Studies in Education at the University of Toronto. She is a contributing author to the online resource, Science of Early Child Development, Canadian and International editions.

ABOUT THE CONVOCATION CEREMONY

The Convocation Procession

The word "convocation" means "calling together," and UNB's convocation is truly a gathering of all individuals who are part of the University – students, professors, administrators, staff, alumni, families and friends. The ceremony starts with the procession of students, special guests, faculty, members of the Senate and the Board of Governors, the honorary degree recipient, the President & Vice-Chancellor, the Chancellor and the Lieutenant-Governor of New Brunswick.

The Stage

All of the formalities around convocation take place on the stage. The stage is occupied by the Lieutenant-Governor, representatives of the Federal, Provincial and Municipal governments, the University's Chancellor, the President & Vice-Chancellor, members of the University's Board of Governors, University officials such as Vice-Presidents, Deans and Directors, University alumni, those holding emeritus status and the honorary degree recipient. The flags at the back of the stage represent the countries that are home to the international students currently studying at UNB Saint John. The banners hanging above the stage represent the various faculties and/or schools in which students may study at UNB Saint John.

Academic Dress

It is part of the ceremony to wear the academic dress of the institution. It is for this reason that all of the students wear the gown, hood and cap, as do most of the University's faculty and officials. At UNB Saint John, the University's alumni are also invited to wear their academic attire and join the procession.

The Ceremonial Mace

The mace symbolizes the authority of the University to award degrees. Introduced in 1996, UNB's ceremonial mace features an antique silver cup atop a wooden shaft. The George II two-handled cup was given to the University in 1995 by S.A.H. Bridge, the great-great-grandson of Sir Howard Douglas, Bart. Sir Howard, Lieutenant-Governor of New Brunswick from 1823 to 1831, was instrumental in gaining the University's Royal charter.

The shaft was created by New Brunswick artisan Michiel Oudemans. Crafted from butternut, a wood indigenous to the province, it features elements of the UNB coat of arms and symbols of New Brunswick: the University motto, Sapere aude (Dare to know); a book of learning; beavers (in honour of Lord Beaverbrook, the University's first modern-day Chancellor); a galley; fiddleheads; and Atlantic salmon.

The mace is carried in the procession by the University Secretary.

Orator: Most distinguished President, most noble Chancellor, all the University, I present to you these supplicants in the above mentioned faculties that they may be admitted to their proper degree of Master (Bachelor), each in his/her own Faculty; and I testify that they, so far as all our statutes require, are fit and suitable.

President: I admit you to the degree of Master (Bachelor) in the University of New Brunswick.

ACADEMIC DRESS

All graduates and members of the academic procession are attired in the basic elements of academic dress – the academic robe, the hood and the mortar board or Tudor hat. The dress worn by each participant depends upon the academic level attained, with special attire for Bachelors, Masters and Doctors. While tradition has indicated the style or cut of the academic attire, each university amends certain details to suit its particular tastes and traditions.

Following is a guide to UNB's ceremonial dress:

GOWNS

Undergraduates	Plain black stuff, sleeveless
Bachelors	Black stuff falling below knee, with full sleeves reaching to the wrist and terminating in a point
Masters	Black silk or stuff falling below knee, with long sleeves with semi-circular cut bottom
Doctors	Scarlet cloth, faced with silk of the same colour as the lining of the hood worn

B.Sc.	Black stuff lined with scarlet silk bordered with white fur
B.Sc. (Applied)	Black silk lined with green silk bordered with white fur

B.Ed.	Black stuff lined with blue grey silk bordered with white fur
B.H.S.	Black stuff lined with teal silk bordered with white fur

M.Sc., M.C.S.	Black silk lined with white bordered with scarlet
