At the beginning of Convocation the audience is requested to stand when the Academic Procession arrives and to remain standing until the close of the Petition by the President. At the close of the Convocation ceremony, following the singing of *O Canada*, the audience should remain standing until the Academic Procession has left the stage.

Graduates are asked to remain in their seats until the Convocation ceremony is completed as a sign of respect and consideration for their classmates.

Although Latin has long ceased to be the language of instruction for all university courses, as it once was at Oxford and Cambridge, at Paris and Bologna, we have retained it at UNB for limited use on occasions of great academic solemnity, such as university convocations. The use of Latin today is a symbol of our academic descent from those earliest universities of medieval Europe and a humble reminder that the search for truth is both ancient and new.

Introduced on the occasion of the university's 225th anniversary, the UNB coin was first presented to members of the graduating class in May 2011. Each limited edition coin is inscribed with the UNB logo, crest, motto - *Sapere Aude* (Dare to be Wise) - and year.

Graduates, it is our hope that this coin will serve as a reminder of your experiences at UNB, the journey you took in reaching your goal, and that you are - and will always be - part of the UNB family.

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT

Suzanne Irving, *Doctor of Letters*

Suzanne Irving was born in Saint John, N.B., daughter of Dr. and Mrs. Isaac Keillor Farrer. A graduate of Saint John High School, Mrs. Irving received her Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Education Degrees from Dalhousie University in Halifax, N.S. She is also a registered Radiology Technician.

Suzanne Irving describes her greatest interests as education, medicine and the arts, and it is in these areas where she has contributed years of community service in her quiet and generous way.

Mrs. Irving served for three successive terms, from 1984 to 1993, on the University of New Brunswick Board of Governors. At the time, she was the first Senate representative appointed to UNB Saint John by then President, Dr. James Downey. Her continued interest in UNB extends to all developments that enable the University to adapt to our changing world.

Mrs. Irving supports the N.B. Museum, and is a past member of its Board of Governors. In addition, she supports the Union Club, and is a past President of the Ladies Section.

She has had a lifetime involvement with Trinity Church in Saint John, and worked with Inner City Youth Ministry under the direction of the Rev. Christopher VanBuskirk.

She supports the Imperial Theatre, Symphony N.B. and Saint John High School. She and her children support the Mount Allison University annual Mansbridge Summit for students, and the Saint John Regional Hospital Foundation, along with the New Brunswick Medical Education Trust with an endowment for Advanced Medical Education in memory of her father, Dr. Isaac Keillor Farrer.

Suzanne Irving is a recipient of the Rotary Club Paul Harris Fellow Award for outstanding commitment to "service above self." She has been described as "thoughtful, approachable and easygoing to work with."

Suzanne Irving is the widow of John E. (Jack) Irving. They have three children - John, Colin and Anne and are fortunate to have six grandchildren.

ABOUT THE CONVOCATION CEREMONY

The Convocation Procession

The word "convocation" means "calling together," and UNB's convocation is truly a gathering of all individuals who are part of the University - students, professors, administrators, staff, alumni, families and friends. The ceremony starts with the procession of students, special guests, faculty, members of the Senate and the Board of Governors, the honorary degree recipient, the President & Vice-Chancellor, the Chancellor and the Lieutenant-Governor of New Brunswick.

The Stage

All of the formalities around convocation take place on the stage. The stage is occupied by the Lieutenant-Governor, representatives of the Federal, Provincial and Municipal governments, the University's Chancellor, the President & Vice-Chancellor, members of the University's Board of Governors, University officials such as Vice-Presidents, Deans and Directors, University alumni, those holding emeritus status and the honorary degree recipient. The flags at the back of the stage represent the countries that are home to the international students currently studying at UNB Saint John. The banners hanging above the stage represent the various faculties and/or schools in which students may study at UNB Saint John.

Academic Dress

It is part of the ceremony to wear the academic dress of the institution. It is for this reason that all of the students wear the gown, hood and cap, as do most of the University's faculty and officials. At UNB Saint John, the University's alumni are also invited to wear their academic attire and join the procession.

The Ceremonial Mace

The mace symbolizes the authority of the University to award degrees. Introduced in 1996, UNB's ceremonial mace features an antique silver cup atop a wooden shaft. The George II two-handled cup was given to the University in 1995 by S.A.H. Bridge, the great-great-grandson of Sir Howard Douglas, Bart. Sir Howard, Lieutenant-Governor of New Brunswick from 1823 to 1831, was instrumental in gaining the University's Royal charter.

The shaft was created by New Brunswick artisan Michiel Oudemans. Crafted from butternut, a wood indigenous to the province, it features elements of the UNB coat of arms and symbols of New Brunswick: the University motto, Sapere aude (Dare to know); a book of learning; beavers (in honour of Lord Beaverbrook, the University's first modern-day Chancellor); a galley; fiddleheads; and Atlantic salmon.

The mace is carried in the procession by the University Secretary.

ACADEMIC DRESS

All graduates and members of the academic procession are attired in the basic elements of academic dress - the academic robe, the hood, and the mortar board or Tudor hat. The dress worn by each participant depends upon the academic level attained, with special attire for Bachelors, Masters and Doctors. While tradition has indicated the style or cut of the academic attire, each university amends certain details to suit its particular tastes and traditions.

Following is a guide to UNB's ceremonial dress:

Masters	Black silk or stuff falling below knee, with long sleeves with semi-circular cut bottom
