At the close of the Convocation ceremony, following the singing of *O Canada*, the audience should remain standing until the Academic Procession has left the stage.

GRADUATES ARE ASKED TO REMAIN IN THEIR SEATS until the Convocation ceremony is completed as a sign of respect and consideration for their classmates.

ALTHOUGH LATIN HAS LONG CEASED to be the language of instruction for all university courses, as it once was at Oxford and Cambridge, at Paris and Bologna, we have retained it at UNB for limited use on occasions of great academic solemnity, such as university convocations. The use of Latin today is a symbol of our academic descent from those earliest universities of medieval Europe and a humble reminder that the search for truth is both ancient and new.

THE CEREMONIAL MACE

The mace, which symbolizes the authority of the University to award degrees, was officially used for the first time at UNB's 167th Encaenia in May 1996.

A gift of the University's fourth modern-day Chancellor, Fredrik S. Eaton, O.C., the mace was proposed by the late Colin B. Mackay, O.C., Q.C., President Emeritus. It measures 4.5 feet in length and features an antique silver cup atop a butternut shaft.

The George II, two-handled cup was given to the University in 1995 by S.A.H. Bridge, the great-great-grandson of Sir Howard Douglas, Bar't. It was once part of a collection of fine silverware presented to Sir Howard by the people of New Brunswick when he returned to England, after serving as Lieutenant-Governor (1823-1831). During his term, Sir Howard took great interest in the institution then known as the College of New Brunswick. He persuaded the British government to grant it a Royal charter, as King's College, and to provide half the funding for the construction of what is now the oldest university building still in use in Canada.

The cup, hallmarked LONDON 1734, is predated by its cover which bears a 1728 hallmark. The armorial engraving on the upper half of the cup and the crest and motto on the cover are those of Douglas of Kirkness, County Kinross.

New Brunswick artisan Michiel Oudeman created the staff for the mace. Crafted from butternut, a wood indigenous to the province, the staff features elements of the UNB coat of arms and symbols of New Brunswick: a book of learning, beavers (in honour of Lord Beaverbrook, the University's first modern-day Chancellor), a galley, fiddleheads, and Atlantic salmon.

The mace is carried in the procession by the University Secretary.

ACADEMIC DRESS

It is part of the ceremony to wear the academic dress of the institution. It is for this reason that all of the students wear the gown, hood and cap, as do most of the University's faculty and officials. At UNB Saint John, the University's alumni are also invited to wear their academic attire and join the procession.

THE CONVOCATION PROCESSION

The word "convocation" means "calling together," and UNB's convocation is truly a gathering of all individuals who are part of the University – students, professors, administrators, staff, alumni, families and friends. The ceremony starts with the procession of students, special guests, faculty, members of the Senate and the Board of Governors, the honorary degree recipient, the President and Vice-Chancellor, the Chancellor and the Lieutenant-Governor of New Brunswick.

THE STAGE

All of the formalities around convocation take place on the stage. The stage is occupied by the Lieutenant-Governor, representatives of the Federal, Provincial and Municipal governments, the University's Chancellor, the President and Vice-Chancellor, members of the University's Board of Governors, University officials such as Vice-Presidents, Deans and Directors, University alumni, those holding emeritus status and the honorary degree recipient. The flags at the back of the stage represent the countries that are home to the international students currently studying at UNB Saint John. The banners hanging above the stage represent the various faculties and/or schools in which students may study at UNB Saint John.

THE UNB ALUMNI PIN

In 2000, the UNB Associated Alumni began the presentation of alumni pins to graduates, and a new tradition was born. This pin is a symbol that you were, are, and will always be, part of our family. UNB alumni around the globe are leaders and innovators. Graduates, we know you will make your own mark on the world. As you do, we hope you will wear your pin with pride.

MASTERS' AND BACHELORS' DEGREES

Orator: *Insignissime Praeses, amplissime Cancellari, supplicanti Senatui et huic venerabili Collegio Gubernatorum quorum nomina ac studia iam rite cognita sunt et promulgata, ut admittantur ad proprium Magistri (Baccalaurei) gradum, in sua quisque Facultate.*

Praeses: *Placetne vobis, Senatores, placetne, Gubernatores, ut hi supplicatores admittantur?*

et Senatores:** *Placet*

Orator: *Insignissime Praeses, amplissime Cancellari, tota Universitas, praesento vobis hosce supplicatores in supra dictis Facultatibus, ut admittantur ad proprium Magistri (Baccalaurei) gradum, in sua quisque Facultate; testorque illos quoad omnia quae statuta nostra requirant aptos et idoneos esse.*

Praeses: *Ego admitto vos ad gradum Magistri (Baccalaurei) in Universitate Novi Brunsvici.*

Orator: Most distinguished President, most noble Chancellor, there supplicate the Senate and this venerable Board of Governors whose names and studies are now formally made known and proclaimed, that they may be admitted to their proper degree of Master (Bachelor) each in his (her) own Faculty.

President: Is it your pleasure, Senators, is it your pleasure, Governors, that these supplicants be admitted?

**Governors
and Senators:** It is our pleasure.

Orator: Most distinguished President, most noble Chancellor, all the University, I present to you these supplicants in the above mentioned faculties that they may be admitted to their proper degree of Master (Bachelor), each in his (her) own Faculty; and I testify that they, so far as all our statutes require, are fit and suitable.

President: I admit you to the degree of Master (Bachelor) in the University of New Brunswick.

ACADEMIC DRESS

All graduates and members of the academic procession are attired in the basic elements of academic dress – the academic robe, the hood, and the mortar board or Tudor hat. The dress worn by each participant depends upon the academic level attained, with special attire for Bachelors, Masters and Doctors. While tradition has indicated the style or cut of the academic attire, each university amends certain details to suit its particular tastes and traditions.

Following is a guide to UNB's ceremonial dress:

GOWNS

Undergraduates | Plain black stuff, sleeveless

Bachelor | Black stuff falling below knee, with full sleeves reaching to the wrist and terminating in a point

Masters | Black silk or stuff falling below knee, with long sleeves with semi-circular cut bottom

Doctors | Scarlet cloth, faced with silk of the same colour as the lining of the hood worn

HOODS

B.A. | Black stuff bordered with white fur

B.Sc. | Black stuff lined with scarlet bordered with white fur

B.Sc. (Applied) | Black stuff lined with green silk bordered with white fur

B.B.A. | Black stuff lined with light brown bordered with white fur

B.N. | Black stuff lined with peach bordered with white fur

B.Ed. | Black stuff lined with grey bordered with white fur

B.H.S. | Black stuff lined with teal bordered with white fur

B.A.M. | Black stuff lined with gold silk bordered with white fur

B.C.S. | Black stuff lined with green bordered with white fur

M.A. | Black silk lined with crimson

M.Sc. | Black silk lined with white bordered with scarlet

M.Sc. (Applied) | Black silk lined with white bordered with green

M.C.S. | Black silk lined with white bordered with green

M.Ed. | Black silk lined with blue grey bordered with crimson

M.N. | Black silk lined with white bordered with peach
